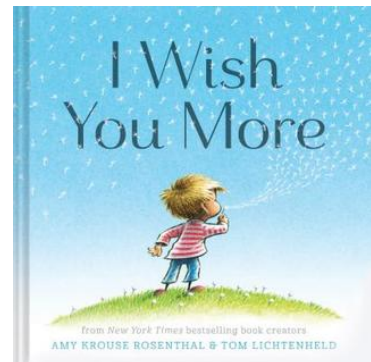
Dear MSS Families,

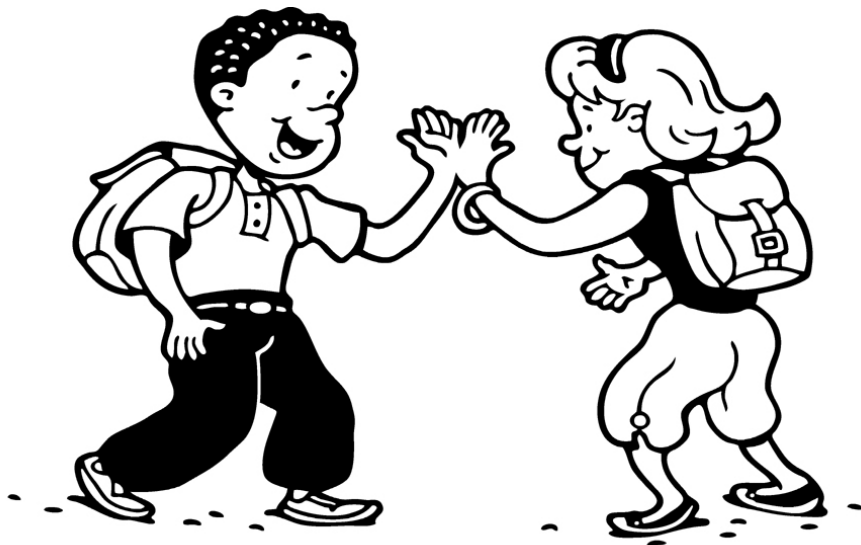
Note from the 68 Hours Program
